

8 Sensory Bin Ideas



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Idea #1



Color Sensory Bins: Fill a tub with items of all one color. Use colored pasta or rice as the base, then add items from around the house that are the same color. Read more [here](#).

Idea #2



St. Patrick's Day Sensory Bins: Use green, yellow, and white shredded paper as a base. Add shamrocks or gold coins to find. Read more St. Patrick's Day ideas [here](#).

Idea #3



ABC Sensory Bins: Use any base (dried beans, water beads, alphabet pasta, etc.) and add alphabet items. Include items of that letter or items that start with that letter. Read more [here](#).

Spring Sensory Bin: Use a base of dried pasta. Add spring items like fabric flowers, plastic bugs, and butterflies. Click [here](#) to find out more.

Idea #5
